Objectives

The Comprehensive Advanced Palliative Care Education program is an immersive experience into the “art” and “science” of providing high quality, best evidence-informed palliative care.

The goals of the CAPCE program are to:

- support the building of individual leadership capacity and the further development of critical thinking skills, enabling nursing professionals to support and participate in the delivery of palliative care of the highest standard at: the bedside, within a team, across an organization, within the community and across the healthcare system
- enable the nursing professional, to the extent of their registered scope of practice, to provide primary level palliative care expertise

Expectations

CAPCE is an 18-week course, during which learners must actively participate in the following:

- **Self-Directed Learning Activities** – Learners complete program content online
- **Three In-Person Classroom Sessions** Learners are present for each session and actively participate in activities and discussions
- **Eight Individual/Small Group Online Coaching Sessions (Approx. 2 hours each)** The CAPCE program integrates coaching and mentoring for nurses to help them embrace their professional standards and demonstrate leadership skills as they evolve into the leadership and mentoring role
- **Eight Peer-to-Peer Exchanges** Learners connect with a peer to enable collaborative learning and shared solution finding
- **Two Practical Application Assignments** These are opportunities for learners to apply what they have learned
