Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) is a fatal motor neuron disease which causes the progressive degeneration of nerve cells in the spinal cord and brain. Eventually, those living with ALS will lose the ability to walk, talk, eat, swallow, and breathe. ALS does not affect intelligence or the ability to think, see or hear.

There is no known cure for ALS; this diagnosis is incredibly overwhelming for individuals and families, as there are many challenges and changes to consider.
